20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Committee was chartered to provide advice on the Office of Space Flight (OSF) programs, policies, plans, and on other matters. Its advice was to span strategic planning, program development, utilization, operations, and management reform initiatives (e.g. institutional assets, human capital management, financial, information technology and competitive sourcing). The Committee was to have concentrated on all aspects of the OSF, including the Space Station program in a multinational partnership, Space Shuttle program, Launch Services, Space Communications systems, Advanced Systems, and commercial partnerships. The Committee was to have drawn on the expertise of its members and other sources to provide advice and make recommendations to the NASA Advisory Council.

The Committee was to hold meetings and make site visits necessary to meet its responsibilities. The Committee was to review reports and recommendations of its subcommittees, panels, and/or task forces and include them, if adopted and appropriate, in its reports to the NASA Advisory Council.However, the Committee did not meet at all during the charter period and was formally terminated on 10/25/04.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Committee was to have consisted of a balanced membership from industry, academia, and Government. Their professional backgrounds would have represented recognized knowledge and expertise in scientific, technological, and programmatic fields relevant to space flight development, operations, utilization, space communications, launch services, advanced systems, and commercialization.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

There were no meetings of the Committee during the charter period.
