The primary focus of the Commission has been to advise the Secretary of the Interior through the park Superintendent about the development and implementation of the park's Backcountry and Wilderness Management Plan, which serves as an amendment to the park's General Management Plan. The Committee has provided feedback and recommendations to the National Park Service.

Commission members represent the tourism industry, off-road vehicle community, climbing interests, mining, home owners, business owners, Native American community, county government and conservation organizations.
