In accordance with Section 10(d) of the Federal Advisory Committee Act, P.L. No. 92-463, as amended (5 U.S.C. App.), it has been determined that certain PHSAC meetings, or portions thereof, concern matters sensitive to homeland security which are listed in 5 U.S.C. §§ 552b(c)(7) and (9)(B) and that, accordingly, meetings will be closed, or partially-closed, to the public. The above determination is based on the consideration that it is expected that discussions involve sensitive matters of homeland security concern throughout. Such homeland security-sensitive material is so intertwined with the non-sensitive material that it cannot reasonably be segregated into separate discussions without defeating the effectiveness and meaning of the overall meeting. To permit meetings of the President's Homeland Security Advisory Council to be completely open to the public would preclude discussion of such sensitive matters and would greatly diminish the ultimate utility of the PHSAC's advice or recommendations to the President of the United States, through the Assistant to the President for Homeland Security.
