20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

Section 492 of the PHS Act states that The Secretary... shall by regulation require appropriate technical and scientific peer review - A) applications...; and B) biomedical and behavioral research and development contracts... This Committee is composed of recognized biomedical and/or behavioral research authorities who

represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide first-level merit review of highly scientific and technical research grant applications of investigator initiated funding of single and/or multi-center clinical trials and registries involving caradiovascular, pulmonary, and blood diseases. During this reporting period, the Committee reviewed 45 applications requesting \$113,609,519.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The members of this Committee are authorities knowledgeable in the fields of fundamental and clinical research in disciplines related to cardiovascular, lung, and blood diseases, as well as epidemiology, biostatistics, and clinical trial design.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The Committee met 3 times during this reporting period.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The Committee is composed of recognized biomedical and behavioral research authorities who represent the forefront of research and technical knowledge and who provide first-level merit review of highly scientific and technical research grant applications. These evaluations and recommendations cannot be obtained from other sources because the specialized, complex nature of the applications require a unique balance and breadth of expertise not available on the NIH staff or from other established sources.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or

partially closed committee meetings?

The meetings of the Committee were closed to the public for the review of grant applications. Sections 552b(c)(4) and 552b(c)(6) of the Government in the Sunshine Act permit the closing of meetings where discussion could reveal confidential trade secrets or commercial property such as patentable material and personal information, the disclosure of which would consitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
