The committee membership comprises diverse expertise and backgrounds reflecting the various interest concerned with the rehabilitation of the Going-to-the-Sun Road. The representation on the committee is as follows: Blackfeet Nation(1), Confederated Salish-Kootenai Tribes (1), local government (2), State of Montana (1), local business (4), state and national tourism (1), national environmental organization (1), historic preservation organization (1), engineering (1), economics (1), Canada - tourism and business (2), and at large (1).

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

Two meetings per year are planned for the duration of the Advisory Committee.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Public Law 105-277 appropriated funds for the project and House Report 105-825 expressed the intent of Congress that use of those funds include a Citizens Advisory Committee with which the National Park Service could consult in making decisions regarding the Going-to-the-Sun Road rehabilitation.
