**20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?**

SENAC is responsible for identifying the key issues, gauging their importance, analyzing the information necessary to resolve the issues, arriving at a consensus, and submitting to the Secretary of Labor the proposed regulatory text and supporting rationale and documentation for an occupational safety standard governing worker safety during steel erection.

**20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?**

Appointees to SENAC include representatives from labor, industry, public interests and government agencies. The appointees also represent groups interested in, or affected by, the

outcome of the rulemaking. SENRAC is comprised of 20 members and a Facilitator.

**20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?**

Meetings were held monthly until the Committee reached consensus on a recommended proposed steel erection standard. The Committee will continue to be in existence, and re-chartered, until the Committee can complete one portion of its original mandate, the standards governing slippery metal deck surfaces. The Committee is seeking information, data, and studies from the public to help in its efforts to develop a recommendation on this issue. The Committee is currently dormant until the promulgation of the final rule. The Committee may be reconvened as necessary to help in the development of the final rule.

**20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?**

Since 1974, OSHA has received many requests to revise subpart R. In 1984, the Agency began drafting a proposed rule to update and clarify subpart R and had been trying to develop an NPRM since that time. OSHA had been unsuccessful in developing an NPRM through traditional rulemaking. The Agency received many recommendations from the ACCSH and affected employee and employer parties to institute Negotiated Rulemaking to help develop a new subpart R proposal. The Agency ultimately determined that Negotiated Rulemaking was the best possible way to develop an NPRM for steel erection.
