20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The committee, a membership of affected and interested parties in the placement, use, and removal of fixed anchors for rock-climbing in congressionally designated wilderness areas administered by the Forest Service, met in face-to-face negotiation, with the assistance of a facilitator, to come to consensus on a proposed rule on the use of fixed anchors in these wilderness areas.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The 24 members of the committee represent interests afffected by the proposed rule: wilderness users, rock-climbers, and wilderness preservationists.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

In FY 2000 the committee met two times.

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Establishing the committee was necessary to attempt to achieve consensus on the appropriateness of fixed anchors within congressionally designated Wilderness. The committee was formed to bring a broad array of national interests together to discuss the future management of wilderness.
