20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Commission holds meetings and public hearings as needed to obtain and discuss drought issues and concerns. The Commission: (1) reviews and analyzes Federal, regional, State, local and tribal drought programs and laws, and other pertinent data; (2) requests and considers public comments submitted including testimony at public hearings; and (3) consults and collaborates with the National Drought Mitigation Center and the Western Drought Coordination Council.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Law specified six Federal members. The three State and local government members includes one woman. Six at-large members represent various groups acutely impacted by drought and includes one woman, for a total of two women, one Native American and one Hispanic. Consideration was given to achieve a balanced representation from different geographic areas of the country, as well as watershed perspective, State level management, and cultural and gender diversity.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

In FY 2000, the Commission held public hearings in Atlanta, GA, Austin, TX, Billings, MT, El Paso, TX, and Los Angeles, CA.. The hearing in El Paso

provided information regarding the international implications of drought, while the hearing in Los Angeles provided insights about highly competitive uses of water in an area where supplies are quite precious. The other three hearings provided an opportunity to hear about how drought during recent years has hurt the populace, hear about the peoples fears if drought continued during 2000 and to learn about how different groups expect to handle drought in the future. In addition to the five hearings, the Commission held four in-person meetings and three teleconferences. The in-person meetings were held in Los Angeles, CA., Scottsdale, AZ., and two in Washington, D.C..

20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

Congress found: (1) there was no coordinated Federal strategy to respond to drought; (2) drought was addressed mainly through special legislation and ad hoc action; (3) there is an increasing need to emphasize preparedness, mitigation and risk management; and (4) there is no single Federal agency to coordinate drought activities. Those seeking assistance were required to deal individually and separately with each Federal agency. The Commission is tasked with submitting a report to the President and Congress that provides advice and recommendations on the creation of an integrated, coordinated Federal policy designed to prepare for and respond to serious drought emergencies.

20e. Why is it necessary to close and/or partially closed committee meetings? Meetings are open to the public.

21. Remarks

Commission submitted its report, "Preparing for Drought in the 21st Century," to the President and Congress on May 16,2000. By law, the Commission terminated 90 days after the report, on Aug 14, 2000. The 1999 Agriculture Appropriations law (PL 105-277, Oct 21, 1998, 112 Stat. 2681), section 719, specifically provided authorization for interagency funding to carry out the purposes of the National Drought Policy Commission. This report asks for the cost of Federal member travel. Therefore we have included estimated travel costs of all six Federal members, including five which were not from USDA and who paid their own travel expenses. The Department of Commerce, Department of the Interior (DOI), and Forest Service (USDA but funded by DOI) contributed money to the Commission's fund and was used to pay expenses included in this report. In addition, several Federal departments, as well as non-governmental entities, provided in-kind services and paid for staff and staff travel. These are not reflected in this report.
