## 20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

The Citizens Advisory Panel (CAP) is authorized by the Attorney General to review civilian complaints made against INS employees and to review the systems and procedures within the INS for responding to such complaints. The CAP seeks to reduce the complaints of impropriety by making recommendations on training standards, the development of higher professionalism of INS' employees, and on the processes INS utilizes for the receipt and review of allegations of misconduct.

## 20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The CAP membership is balanced in terms of the points of view represented and the functions to be performed. The CAP is comprised of nine private

citizens, five Department of Justice members, and one non-voting member from the Government of Mexico. Each member was chosen for his or her knowledge of immigration issues, ethics in the law enforcement field, experience in human and civil rights issues, and participation in community activities.

## 20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

The CAP met on February 3-4, 1997, to reach concensus on its report to the Attorney General on its findings and recommendations.

# 20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?

The unique mix of panel members' backgrounds and their knowledge of the public's perception of INS functions within their communities afforded INS insights which would not otherwise be available. The public CAP meetings provided a forum in which the INS opened itself to public scrutiny and provided a sound vehicle for open dialogue with its customers.
