20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?

House Conference Committee Report 102-236 directed the Army to establish this committee to assist in the management of all Yakima Training Center (YTC) lands. The Army was also tasked to develop a comprehensive, integrated training strategy, which addresses the recommendations of the Committee, before the expansion lands can be used for military training. Pursuant to a memorandum of agreement entered into by the Army and the State of Washington, the committee is also required to develop a cultural and natural resources management plan (CNRMP) for the entire YTC. In FY97, the CNRMP was completed and delivered to the appropriate congressional committees on February 11, 1997, thus completing the committee's primary mission.

20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?

The Conference Committee Report cited above specifies the make up of the committee. Membership includes the Army, the Air Force (not currently participating) and the Army National Guard, all of which train at YTC. It includes representative of Yakima and Kittitas Counties in which YTC is physically located, representatives of the City of Yakima, the laraest city in the area, and representatives of the Yakama Indian Nation, the U. S. Fish & Wildlife Service and the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife. The Wanapum people also attend meetings; however, they have chosen not to be formally appointed as members.

20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?

With the completion of the CNRMP, the committeemet once to terminate the CNRMP. The committee meetings also serve as a forum for discussion of environmental issues which affect the general public.
