**20a. How does the Committee accomplish its purpose?**

The Army Education Advisory Committee provides advice on Army educational programs and educational matters of interest to the Secretary of the Army. The committee operates through 5 subcommittees: The Command & General Staff College (C&GSC) Subcommittee, The Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) Subcommittee, The School of Americas (SOA) Subcommittee, The U.S. Army War College (USAWC) Subcommittee, and The Distance Learning/Training Technology Applications Subcommittee (DLTT). The advice, counsel and recommendations of the subcommittees assist the

Army by: reviewing the curriculum and academic issues for the C&GSC providing advice on a wide range of ROTC issues; reviewing curriculum, policies, and objectives of the SOA; reviewing pertinent issues relating to the USAWC; and providing advice on effective distance learning technologies and their application to Army education and training. The USAWC Subcommittee continued to pursue master's degree-granting approval. The ROTC Subcommittee has recommended the use of Distance Learning Technology in the training of its cadets. The DLTT Subcommittee is committed to maximizing the most modern technologies available in training our student cadets and our soldiers. The SOA Subcommittee continued to provide program assessment, advice, and recommendations on the curriculum, educational philosophy, and resource requirements for the School of the Americas. The C&GSC remained focused on its role to represent the public interest in its recommendations and advice concerning curriculum renewal, accreditation reviews, and technology applications.

**20b. How does the Committee balance its membership?**

All members of the subcommittees must be members of the Army Education Advisory Committee which is composed of not more than 60 members. The C&GSC Subcommittee is composed of not more than 12 members selected from the civilian education community. In order for the C&GSC to be an accredited institution, the North Central Association (NCA) stipulates that the College maintain a board of distinguished civilian educators representing prominent academic institutions in each of the 6 regional accrediting associations. Accordingly, the C&GSC

has appointed 2 members from institutions of the NCA; at least one member is from an institution in each of the other 5 regional accrediting associations. All members represent both public and private institutions and a variety of academic disciplines and appointments. The ROTC Subcommittee consists of no more than 16 members selected from the 6 national educational organizations, the 3 ROTC regions, and the private sector. There is a balance of women and minorities and care is taken to assure the appropriate geographic mix. The SOA Subcommittee is composed of no more than 12 members selected from the fields of education, Latin American studies, foreign affairs, human rights, international law, and national security affairs. The USAWC Subcommittee is composed of no more than 10 members selected from the areas of academics (5 members), former military (3 members), and business/industry (2 members). The DLTT is composed of no more than 10 members from academia, business, and industry. All members must be specialists who develop, manage, and/or use distance learning, its required facilities, and infrastructure, and new training technologies.

**20c. How frequent and relevant are the Committee Meetings?**

The C&GSC Subcommittee meets each year in the spring. The C&GSC, USAWC, and DLTT Subcommittees meet at least once a year. The SOA Subcommittee meets at least once a year and not more than 3 times per year. The C&GSC and USAWC Subcommittees are a requirement for Federal Degree Granting Authority and a subsequent accreditation to award a Master's Degree.

**20d. Why can't the advice or information this committee provides be obtained elsewhere?**

As explained above the C&GSC must bring together an outside body comprised of nationally recognized individuals representing the various regional, academic and minority interests in order to retain accreditation of its Master Degree Program. Likewise, the Reserve Officers' Corps does not have a mechanism other than the ROTC Subcommittee to determine the views and obtain advice of academia and industry on the Army ROTC Program. The SOA Subcommittee is a unique organization and there is no other committee or subcommittee that possesses the level of expertise required to provide relevant program assessment to the Commander, TRADOC. The USAWC receives advice from academia, military, and industry which enables the College to maintain the highest education standards and quality of education. The DLTT members are all specialists who develop, manage, and/or use distance learning, its required facilities, and infrastructure, and new training technologies to ensure the latest advice on distance learning for our soldiers.

Subcommittee reviewed and provided to the Commander, TRADOC, program assessment, advice, and recommendations on the curriculum, educational philosophy, and resource requirements for the School of the Americas. The C&GSC Subcommittee remained focused on its role as representing the public interest in its recommendations and advice concerning curriculum renewal, accreditation reviews, and technology applications made to the USA C&GSC.
