The AAPB Advisory Committee shall advise the Secretary of Transportation on issues relating to air ambulance services and patient billing by reviewing options to improve the disclosure of charges and fees for air medical services, better inform consumers of insurance options for such services, and protect consumers from balance billing. It shall also make recommendations with respect to disclosure of charges and fees for air

ambulance services and insurance coverage, consumer protection and enforcement authorities of both the Department of Transportation and State authorities, and the prevention of balance billing to consumers.

Membership is balanced to include all the groups specified in the committee's establishment authority.

The Advisory Committee met three times: Once on January 15-16, 2020, once on May 27-28 2021, and once on August 11 2021. The first meeting provided the opportunity for the Committee to gather information on air ambulance and patient billing issues. The second two meetings produced recommendations.
